

CANDLES LIGHT UP THE HOLIDAY

You need: 2 candlesticks + a lighter. Light 2 candles, cover your eyes and say:

Blessed are You, Adonai our God, Overseer of all existence, who commands us to light this candle on this holy day.

— Amen

WINE MARKS THIS MEAL AS SPECIAL (KIDDUSH)

You need: A glass of wine or grape juice. Raise the glass and say:

Blessed are You, Adonai our God, Overseer of all existence, who creates the fruit of the vine.

— Amen

A blessing said over wine marks the beginning of a holiday meal. Special Shabbat text is added on Friday night, and Havdala text is added on Saturday night.

On Friday night, start here (otherwise, skip):

The sixth day. And the heavens and the earth and all their hosts were completed. And on the seventh day God finished His work which He had made, and He rested on the seventh day from all His work which He had made. And God blessed the seventh day and made it holy, for on it He rested from all His work which God created to make.

On a weekday, start here:

Blessed are You, Adonai (God), Overseer of all existence, who creates the fruit of the vine.

— Amen



On Saturday night add this separation (Havdala) text:

Blessed are You, Adonai (God) who creates the lights of fire. Blessed are You, Adonai (God) Overseer of the Universe, who makes a distinction between sacred and profane, between light and darkness, between Israel and the nations, between the seventh day and the six work-days.

You have made a distinction between the holiness of the Shabbat and the holiness of the festival, and You have sanctified the seventh day above the six work-days.

You have set apart and made holy

Raise the glass again and say:

Blessed are You,
Adonai our God, Overseer
of all existence, who has
enabled us to be alive,
to exist, and to arrive,
at this very moment.

— Amen

DIP CHALLAH IN HONEY TO MAKE THE YEAR SWEET

You need: A round challah (to symbolize the cycle of the year) + honey. Spread honey on the bread and say:


Blessed are You, Adonai our God, Overseer of all existence, who has brought forth bread from the earth.

— Amen



DIP APPLE IN HONEY TO MAKE THE YEAR SWEET

You need: Freshly sliced apples + honey.

Dip the apple in the honey and say:

Blessed are You, Adonai our God, Overseer of all existence, who created fruit of the tree.

— Amen



A FISH-HEAD TO REMIND US TO BE THE HEAD, NOT THE TAIL

You need: A fish-head (cold and pre-cooked). You can substitute with a lettuce head. Even a toy will do. Present the fish, (you may also take a tiny bite) and say:

May it be so, our God,
Overseer of all existence,
who watched over our
ancestors, that we become
like the head
and not like the tail.
— Amen

You need: Pomegranate seeds. Hold a spoonful of seeds and say:

May it be so, our God,
Overseer of all existence,
that our year be rich and
full of blessings as the
pomegranate is rich
and full of seeds.

— Amen



— Amen

After eating the date, take another one and say:


May it be your will, Adonai, our God and the God of our fathers, that there come an end to our enemies, haters and those who wish evil upon us.

You need: Beets. Take a beet and say:

May it be your will, Adonai, our God and the God of our fathers, that our enemies, haters and those who wish evil upon us shall depart.



PEAS OR BEANS FOR PROSPERITY



You need: Black-eyed peas, green beans, or fenugreek.


Blessed are You, Adonai our God, Overseer of all existence, who created fruit of the earth.

Baruch Atah Adonai, Eloheinu Melech Ha-Olam, boreh pri ha-adama.



'Rubia', another name for string beans, sounds like the word 'rabim', which means 'many' in Hebrew. We eat beans in hope for prosperity.

Take some beans and say:

May it be your will, Adonai, our God and the God of our fathers, that that our merits shall increase and that You hearten us.

— Amen

GOURD TO TEAR DOWN INJUSTICE IN OUR COMMUNITY

You need: Gourd (pumpkin).
Take a gourd and say:


May it be your will, Adonai, our God and the God of our fathers, that the evil of our verdicts be ripped, and that our merits be announced before you.

— Amen

'Kra,' the Hebrew word for gourd (or pumpkin), means 'tear.' We hope to 'tear down' any injustice in our community.

CARROTS TO BRING ON A GOOD YEAR

You need: Carrots.
Hold a carrot and say:

May it be your will Adonai, our God and God of our fathers, that our evil decree will be annulled and our merits will be recalled."

— Amen

The Hebrew word for carrot, 'gezer' sounds like the Hebrew word 'ligzor', which means to cut. We eat carrots in hopes to cut out the bad news, and make it a new year!
